# **Crochet Tree**

Have you spotted the olive tree covered in crochet pieces outside the Municipal Art Gallery? Peace2Peace are a group comprising more than 60 Greek Cypriot and Turkish Cypriot women and other nationalities, living in Cyprus and abroad, promoting peace and friendship. There is also an installation on the fencing of St. Sophia Mosque (Cami-I Kebir) and previously, on an old anchor at the harbour.

Women from all over Cyprus meet and jointly create crochet installations, highlighting the concepts of creativity, peace and coexistence. Crochet, as one of the most widespread traditional handicrafts acts as a link to the daily lives of people and the crochet pieces are part of the same connective web comprising

diverse patterns.


Following the group's first

event, a similar group made up of women from both Israel and Palestine contacted them to form a collaboration. They are named Piece4Peace and carry out similar activities, but theirs involves quilting. So, in the future, pieces will be exchanged between the groups. These Israeli and Palestinian women also want peace and freedom.



# Sally Has A New Friend

Over the past ten years the wettest year has been 2012 with over 170 million cubic metres (MCM) of rain being collected in all the dams of Cyprus during the first four months of the year. The driest year was 2014 with a mere 6 MCM in the same period. 2016 wasn't much better with just 12 MCM being collected. 2017 was little better with just under 40 MCM being collected.

# **Yeronisos Island**

Yeronisos Island is a small island lying off the west coast 18 kilometres from Paphos. Uninhabited since the 15th century, recent excavations have revealed it once held a sanctuary dedicated to Apollo in the late Hellenistic period. For years, archaeologists have been digging at Yeronisos Island off the coast of Peyia. The local landmark – also known as "Holy Island" measures just 300 yards long by about 75 yards wide. During the winter months the island is so green it looks more like an outcrop of Ireland or the British Isles. Yeronisos has been uninhabited since Byzantine times and remains one of the last naturally protected nesting sites for birds, including the yellow-footed gull, rock doves, jackdaws, swifts, and cormorants. For nearly two decades New York University professor, Joan Breton Connelly has been bringing students to help with the digs, which have revealed Yeronisos had a very active Hellenistic period of occupation and religious worship, along with Chalcolithic and Byzantine levels. The Golden Age of Yeronisos was in the Hellenistic period, the time following the death of Alexander the Great when the Ptolemies of Egypt ruled Cyprus. In 2013 cups, bowls, jugs and plates were unearthed within small rooms where dining appears to have taken place during the final years of Egyptian rule.

# Cyprus Becomes Independent Republic

Cyprus was declared an independent republic on 16th August 1960 and became a member of the United Nations, the British Commonwealth, the Council of Europe, the Non-aligned Movement and other international organisations.

#### The MV Edro III



A couple of months ago we wrote about the shipwreck that can be seen from Kamares Village, the MV Demetrios II. There is another ship stuck on the coast and is also visible from parts of Kamares. The MV Edro III is stuck on rocks near Sea Caves and has been there since 8th December 2011.

The Sierra Leone registered ship was sailing from Limassol to Rhodes in heavy seas when it ran aground after technical problems with the engine. There was a crew of nine aboard all of whom were safely airlifted to Paphos by RAF helicopter. The cargo of plaster board and the fuel oil has been removed and the ship has been left, listing by about 10 degrees.


In a quote to the *Cyprus Sunday Mail* Nicos Attas, a marine surveyor from the department of merchant shipping, in May 2014 said, "I hope that this ship won't stay on the rocks indefinitely; it's just a matter of money. It will cost roughly around half a million euros to move and transport the vessel to a scrap yard," He, Mr Attas, went on to say. "There is an international market value for the weight of scrap steel; unfortunately the costs appear to exceed the scrap value."

Although you can't go on-board the ship you can get very close.


