Road Tax for 2018



Your Road Tax for 2018 can be renewed from Monday, 8th
January. The tax may be paid at any bank, citizens' service centre, district post office, district office of the road transport department, or online by clicking here. You will have until Sunday, 11th March to renew your tax because from the following day the police will be reporting those who are driving untaxed vehicles. If you pay after March 11 there will be charge of €10 plus 10 per cent of the amount due for the year.

On the 23rd June 2017 a new law was passed by the Government, regulating the operation of Clubs and NGO's in Cyprus, we received our official notification and paperwork early in November 2017, this was all in Greek! Thanks go to Panayiotis who allowed Zacharo from reception time to

translate these official forms for us. Thank you Zacharo.

The committee then sought advice from the Hellenic Bank and came to the conclusion that an English speaking Lawyer who was fully qualified in this particular field was required, to explain fully the options open to us, especially as all paperwork was to be first translated into English then back into Greek. We had our first hour long meeting with the Lawyer on Wednesday 13th December 2017 and as a result of the information received, the committee made the decision to register under the new Law.

The committee will convene early in January 2018 and this matter will be our highest priority. Further information in the New Year.

The second phase of an upgrading project to revamp the centre of Tala village in Paphos is earmarked to get underway in the first few months of 2018, according to officials. Earlier this year, an overhaul of the popular village centre was completed before Easter, ahead of schedule, due to a mild winter. The square was pedestrianised and modernised to create an attractive centre for the entire village. This phase will include upgrading the network of roads around the square, levelling some and creating a one-way system. The road network around the square will be widened where possible, roads will be resurfaced, some roads will be designated as one-way, and additional car parking will be created.

Demographic Developments



In 2016 the number of people living in government controlled Cyprus was just over 848 thousand up 0.8% over 2015. Nearly 9,500 children were born, an increase of 285 since 2015. In order to replace the population you need 2.1 children per woman and in Cyprus it is only 1.37 and has remained below 2.1 since 1995.

We lost just over 5,400 people in 2016. Life expectance for men is slightly over 80 and for women it is just under 85. Marriage remains popular with 6,375, involving Cyprus residents, in 2016 up 283 from 2015. Nearly 62% of weddings were ecclesiastical. On the downside, divorce increased from 1,807 in 2015 to 1,948 in 2016.

Net migration in 2016 was one short of 2,500 and was positive for the first time since 2012.
