Update from Paphos District Office – 'Slipping Building'

I am sure we are all delighted to receive the news that a demolition order has been received by the District office from the Court. The work will have to be sent out for tender as it is a Government contract. We must not expect to have our old route in and out of Kamares back in the immediate future, but at least there is the knowledge that things are happening.

Previous to this news, I had received from PDO Mary Lambrou, a request that I would cease sending her emails on this subject, as she was being inundated by other interested parties. She stated that when there was any official news she would contact Cathi Delaney Tala C.C and myself, KVHA – this she has done.

I am happy to cut back on the emails now we have the demolition order in place, but I can't promise not to start up again if needed.

Slipping Telegraph Poles

After receiving concerned reports regarding the road outside the 'Slipping Bld,' and the danger of the telegraph poles heading down into the ravine, I contacted the Electricity board seeking to confirm that should this happen the supply of electricity to Kamares and areas would not be affected.

Much to my amazement, within the hour I received a call from the Engineers who were actually on site, informing me that they had reported to Head Office, as they were shocked at the speedy deterioration of the building and the road.

The phone rang and it was the Chief Engineer from Head Office, thanking me for contacting them and assuring me that if the building collapsed and the poles went over the ravine, there was no supply of electricity connected. The supply to the remaining villa(s) was underground and away from the Slipping Building, however he was trying to get permission from the District Office to remove the poles on the edge of the ravine, and would contact me if this was to happen. Thank you Electricity Board of Cyprus.

Why not give it a go, it is very interesting and sometimes very rewarding – ‘someone has to do it’....

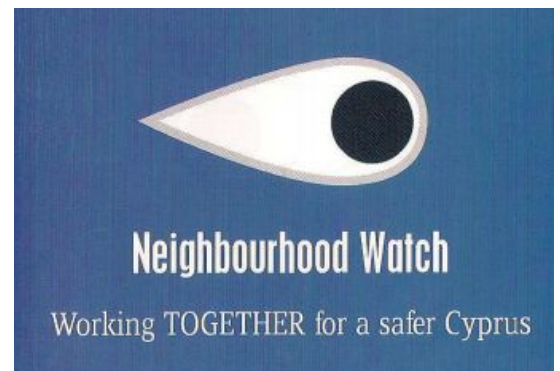
Neighbourhood Watch

From various sources it is evident that attempted break ins and burglaries are with us again.

Can all members take the well known basic precautions to reduce their risk of that particular crime:

1. Ensure all doors, windows and exterior sheds are securely locked, even if only “popping out” for a short time.
2. Secure with chains/padlocks all ladders outside
3. Tell neighbours if away on holiday and provide contact details.
4. If an attempted break in or actual burglary takes place please report immediately to Police (The Police cannot obviously be blamed regarding reactions, statistics, resolving crimes if they do not receive reports from the public.)

Koili C.C.

Regional Center for Education and Farming of Agricultural Occupations / Products. It is the first of its kind and covers twelve communities

The first of its kind, the Regional Center for Education and Training of Agricultural Professions / Products, is set up in Koili village in Paphos, with the aim of training young farmers in the communities of Koili, Lassa, Drimou, Drinia, Agios Dimitrianos, Psathi, Strombi, Tsada, Kalepeia, and Polemiou. The work on the building infrastructure of the Center has begun and continues at a rapid pace, in the area of Koili, despite the junction with the main street of Paphos-Polis at the height of Tsada. The contracts for the construction of the Center were signed by the District Administration of Pafos by the District Officer Mary Lambros and the successful tenderers since last June, amounting to approximately 1.7 million euros. The project will be completed in 18 months and will be co-financed by the European Agricultural Fund for Rural Development, the Republic of Cyprus and the Koili community. Paphos Prosecutor Mary Lambrou pointed out that the project aims to organize educational lectures on agricultural professions, agricultural products and post-harvest management of fresh products. There will be joint demonstrations of the production of traditional products and the operation of a small distillery. The center will be able to host other similar activities related to traditional products. "This project consists of three floors," he explained. "The basement consists of two warehouses, sanitary and changing rooms, stairwells and natural ventilation space. The ground floor consists of an information room, a kiosk, a traditional product maker, including warehouses, two workshops for traditional products, sanitary facilities, dining room, office space, reception area, first aid room, and a large exhibition area. The floor consists of three office halls, including conference rooms, corridors, stairwells and a lecture hall. Perimeter of the proposed building is made up of 42 parking spaces, paved areas, flower gardens, playgrounds and a large green space. "

The proposed project is of overriding importance, since there is no similar work across the province.
