

MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

Dear Neighbours,

As we settle into the heart of summer, it's clear that many of our residents are away enjoying a well-earned break. With that in mind, activity across the village has been a little quieter this month - but that hasn't stopped progress.

First and foremost, I want to extend a sincere thank you to the Tala Council for the excellent work they've done on street cleaning. I think many of you will have noticed just how much cleaner the sidewalks and pavements are looking—it's made a real difference and deserves recognition.

In addition, following our recent meetings with the Council, they quickly acted on our concerns regarding sidewalk conditions. Several sidewalks across Kamares have now been repaired, and the improvement is clear to see. Their swift response shows just how valuable our collaboration with local authorities can be.

We also raised concerns about residents experiencing water shortages, and I'm happy to report that the Council took this seriously. Working with their local partners, they sourced additional water from higher up the hill, and since then, we've not received any further reports of shortages. That progress came out of direct discussions we had with both the Council and representatives from Leptos, and it shows what we can achieve when everyone comes to the table.

One point I want to clarify in this newsletter is the relationship between the KVHA and the Kamares Club. While we often hold events at the Club, it's important to note that the Kamares Club is owned and operated by the Leptos family, and not by KVHA. We have a good working relationship, but the Club is not under KVHA management or ownership.

Speaking of the broader community, I'm sure many of you have noticed that we've begun to step up efforts to clean up Kamares. I've recently written to Mr. Paris Gabriel, Executive Director of Leptos, requesting that they address dump sites along the Koili road, as well as other unsightly areas within the community that are not in keeping with a residential neighbourhood. We're awaiting a response, and I'll keep you updated on progress in the next newsletter.

Thank you as well to everyone who provided feedback on the future design of our new park. There was a strong consensus around creating a relaxing green space with benches - a peaceful area to enjoy the view and the surroundings. This is also a practical and achievable approach based on the budget we have.

We also had a small but meaningful success with the Koili Council. One of our residents raised concerns about a neighbour not cleaning up their sidewalk following construction. After we brought this to the Council's attention, they contacted the homeowner directly and set a deadline. We're grateful to the resident for complying, and it's a good example of how community cooperation, supported by KVHA, can lead to results.

In bigger news, our new membership management system is now being rolled out. This means we are moving entirely online: no more paper forms, no more cash payments. Everything - sign-ups, renewals, and payments - will be handled digitally going forward. It's a big step forward for efficiency and record-keeping, and we appreciate your support in embracing the change.

We're also happy to report that the Greek lessons, which have been a great success, are currently doing revision before taking a short break for summer. A new term of lessons will begin in September, and KVHA members are warmly invited to attend. For more information, or to register your interest, please contact Ismini on 9914 3931.

Finally, I want to say how pleased we are with the new complaints email system: complaints@kvha.cy. It's already been well-used, and it's giving us valuable insight into what's going on around the village. If you've submitted a concern - thank you. I try to reply to every message personally, but if you haven't heard back yet, please know that it has been received and logged. Some issues can be addressed quickly, while others will be raised at upcoming meetings with the Tala or Koili councils.
