MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

Dear Neighbours,

As we move into September, I'm pleased to be able to share some good news at last regarding the Kamares Club. After quite a long wait, Leptos has begun carrying out some repairs and improvements. They've put down new plants, started work on paving, repainted the exterior, and are also renovating the wooden sections around the pool. They've assured us that the ring around the pool is being dealt with too — it's a stubborn problem, but each week more of it is being scrubbed away, and the aim is to remove it completely over time.

This is encouraging progress and a welcome sign that the club is finally receiving some attention. That said, we haven't yet heard of any plans for the inside of the club or for changes to the facilities and services offered, but we'll keep pushing for more information. At the same time, we have also started discussions with Leptos on what to do about the dump at the top of the community. Our emails have been acknowledged by Paris Gabriel, which is at least a step forward, and we'll keep you updated as these conversations progress.

More good news is that the renovation of the library has been completed, including the removal of mold. It's another small but important improvement for our community, and it's great to see this space brought back into good condition.

Looking ahead, a few important things are happening before our AGM on 21st October. The road-marking project is approved and ready, awaiting cooler weather so the paint sets properly. The first round of the community census will go out in early October. Our new online membership system is live, making it easier to join and renew; paper and cash will only be used where residents genuinely cannot use technology. And on **20th September** we'll hold a Litter Pick to coincide with **World Cleanup Day**. This won't just be at the entrance to Kamares — many of the roads around the village also need a good clean-up, so we really do need as many people as possible to come along and help.

At the AGM we'll ask members to approve raising the annual KVHA fee from €5 to €10. Alongside this, we'll introduce a voluntary contribution system, with the aim of eventually funding a dedicated groundsman for Kamares. We're also in discussions with the council to see if they can support this role; more details will follow in October's newsletter.






