MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

Dear Neighbours,

As we move into October and approach our Annual General Meeting next week on the 21st, this feels like the right moment to step back and reflect on where we are as a community. I'd like to share some thoughts on three key relationships that shape life here in Kamares: our relationship with Leptos, our relationship with the Tala and Koili Councils, and, most importantly, our responsibilities as homeowners ourselves.

Michael Leptos built Kamares into a thriving and attractive community. For many years, he supported the estate and the Kamares Club, which was once the beating heart of village life. Since his passing in 2016, however, Kamares has not had the same level of attention from the Leptos family or the business. Some residents still feel that Leptos has an ongoing responsibility here. But the truth is that residents don't pay them any fees, and our infrastructure is maintained by the Tala and Koili Councils. For newer residents especially, there is no real connection with Leptos at all beyond the estate's history.

That said, Leptos has never fully stepped away. They continue to own unsold plots, which at times have been used for storage or dumping, and they have promised for years to renovate the club. Progress on that front has been slow, but in recent months we have at least seen some encouraging small steps: new plants, paving, repairs around the pool, and fresh paint. We hope this might mark a turning point. Our role, however, must be to plan and act for the future as though the responsibility lies with us - because, in reality, it does. If Kamares is to remain a place we are proud to call home, then it is up to us, as residents together, to take the lead.

Over the last few months I've also met and conversed with both the Tala and Koili Councils, and it's become very clear how limited their resources are. Their strategy is to focus those resources on the biggest problems affecting the largest number of people. That means that when Tala or Koili as a whole has a major issue, the money goes there - and Kamares may have to wait years before it is back in focus. On paper, the councils are responsible for roads, drains, and green areas. In practice, they can only be relied on for emergencies or urgent situations. Day-to-day maintenance such as clearing

drains, trimming greenery, and keeping public areas tidy is not something they are in a position to deliver consistently.

This is why it's so important to reset our expectations. If we want Kamares to be well maintained, safe and attractive, it falls to us as homeowners to make that happen. The KVHA has always been a social and representative body, but it's time for us to evolve into a true homeowners' association that takes a more active role in caring for our village. To start, we are asking members to approve raising the annual KVHA fee from €5 to €10. It's a modest increase, but it's an important first step in showing what we can achieve together. Alongside this, we have launched a contribution programme, with contributions starting at €50. The response so far has been very encouraging: just five or six members have already contributed or pledged close to €4,000 between them. Our goal is €17,000, which would allow us to hire a full-time groundsman through the council, dedicated to working here in Kamares. If more residents are able to contribute, even modestly, we can reach that goal much sooner. A sincere thank you to those who have already contributed so generously. Your support has given this project a real boost, and we hope many more of you will join in helping us reach our target.

Looking ahead, there are a number of important developments. The road-marking project is scheduled to begin on the 20th of October. The first round of the community census has already been rolled out, and we've received an encouraging number of responses so far. Our new online membership system is also live, making it simple to renew or join - cash and paper will only be used in exceptional cases. The weekly quiz at the Sheep continues to be one of the most popular successes of the year, with 30–50 participants each week, and Greek Conversation with Ismini is now well underway, giving residents the chance to learn and practise Greek while meeting new friends.

On Saturday 20th September, as part of World Cleanup Day, 34 residents came together for a community litter pick. Over an hour and a half we collected around 40–50 bags of rubbish from across Kamares, which the council then removed first thing Monday morning. It was a wonderful turnout, great fun, and a fantastic way to show what we can achieve together. A big thank you to everyone who joined in - we hope to organise another clean-up in three or four months' time. Afterwards, the group enjoyed a well-earned beverage on the KVHA, which was a lovely way to finish the morning in good company.

In another example of great neighbourhood coordination, the Zelemenos neighbourhood gathered for lunch on Saturday 11th October at Vathoutkia. Thank you to everyone who attended - it was a wonderful way for neighbours to get to know each other better.

As always, we also need more helping hands. In addition to the elected board, there are a number of non-board roles open for residents who want to get involved: Planning Enforcement, Water Issues, Traditional Physical Marketing, eMarketing, Public Gardens and Parks, Event Planning, Children and Youth Activities, Sports and Recreation, Online Sales Portal, and Eco Patrol. These are all completely voluntary positions. They are not full-time jobs, and there's no expectation of set hours or rigid reporting. We're simply looking for people who can give a little of their time and energy in areas that interest them. Even small contributions make a big difference. The roles are informal - keep an eye on things, let us know occasionally what you've been working on, and we'll support you with whatever resources you may need. If you'd like to get more involved, even in a small way, we'd be delighted to have you join us.

We look forward to seeing as many of you as possible at the Annual General Meeting on Tuesday, 21st October, from 3:00pm to 5:00pm at the Kamares Club. It is especially important this year that you make the effort to attend, as we need a quorum in order for the meeting to go ahead and for any decisions to be approved. Without enough members present, we cannot move forward with the plans we've been working on together. Please do try to come along, even if just for a short while. Your presence really does make a difference, and this is your opportunity to have your say in shaping the future of Kamares.

After the meeting, the Kamares Club will be offering a buffet for €25 (call 26880576 to book) and the KVHA will provide some drinks - a chance to relax, chat and enjoy time together as neighbours once the business of the day is done.


CLEANUP DAY
